#### **Mathematics**

All grades are currently looking at *Location and Transformation* as their measurement strand within Mathematics. But what does this mean for your child? This area of the curriculum covers aspects such as:

Foundation - using positional language (behind, beside, in front) relating to themselves

Grade 1 - interpret a simple diagram or picture to describe the position of an object.

Grade 2 - draw an informal map or sketch to provide directions

Grade 3 - *Transformations* - identifying symmetry in *natural* and *constructed* environments

Grade 4 - *Transformations* - creating symmetrical patterns, pictures and shapes with and without digital technologies.

Grade 5 - creating simple aerial maps inclusive of a grid reference system to locate features and describe routes

Grade 6 - *Transformations* - identifying and describing simple transformations in the Cartesian plane

If you are interested in what the curriculum covers at any grade level, on any domain, don't hesitate to ask.

The National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is being conducted earlier than usual this year. There is a two week period in March in which schools can select when they will carry out the four assessments - Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy. This assessment tool is for students across Australia in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9. Please have a look at the calendar above to see when we have chosen to conduct these tests so you can endeavour to have your child here on those dates. There is not a lot of room for makeup dates. Shortly our Grade 3 and 5 students will participate in a practice NAPLAN test in order for them to become familiar with the online format of the program. We will be discussing the similarities and differences between books and making text connections :-

Text to Self (connecting a text with your life experiences)

Text to World (connecting a text with real world experiences)

Please encourage your child to read as much as possible, as often as possible. Make the time to chat about the books they bring home to create a really positive 'reading culture'.

Students can borrow up to three books. Please bring a bag and remember to return each fortnight. Library at Greta Valley is on the even weeks (2,4,6,8,10).
